Cocoa patches: patches are joined, in need of maintenance, too many sgade trees, have limited varieties, and fruiting.


Coffee Patches – Small patches, close proximity, fruiting and flowering, trees more than 80 years old, beyond maturity and limited productivity. The area is Robusta dominant with very few Arabica.
